

May 2013 Graduating Student Survey Results



Executive Summary

Methodology notes:

This report summarizes students' responses to the May 2013 Graduating Student Survey. Students' responses were analyzed to fit the categories presented in the survey.

Survey Administration:

UMHB graduated 450 (29 in absentia) students at its commencement ceremony May 4, 2013. Of these graduates, 318 completed the graduating students survey, giving us a 70.6 % response rate overall. Students received a copy of the survey at commencement rehearsal Friday, May 3.

Of the students that participated in this commencement, 2 degrees were conferred December 7, 2012 and 339 degrees were conferred May 4, 2013. 97 are expected to be conferred August 2, 2013 and 5 on December 13, 2013.

Post-Graduate Plans:

When asked to indicate their post-graduate plans for the coming year, 72.6 % of respondents indicated a plan to be employed full-time, while 14.8 % plan to pursue graduate study. 10.7 % indicated they are undecided about their future plans.

Graduate Study:

Of those planning to pursue graduate study, 60.0 % have already been accepted into graduate school, 40.0 % are waiting for acceptance.

Employment:

Of those pursuing full-time employment, 44.5 % are already employed or have accepted a new job, and 51.6 % indicated that they are just beginning their job search. Of those with employment, the most typical salary range (for 40.0 % of respondents) was \$40,000-\$49,999. Our most frequent employers for these graduates are medical facilities (especially Scott and White). Job titles showed a higher frequency in nursing and education.

Career Services:

Of those surveyed, 42.2 % visited the Career Services Office, while 51.3 % used their website. 61.3 % attended a job fair held at UMHB, and 46.8 % plan to stay in the Belton/Bell County area.

Overall Satisfaction:

Of those surveyed, 92.5 % would recommend UMHB to a friend or relative considering college, 84.5 % would enroll in UMHB again, 93.5 % were very satisfied or satisfied with their overall experience at UMHB.

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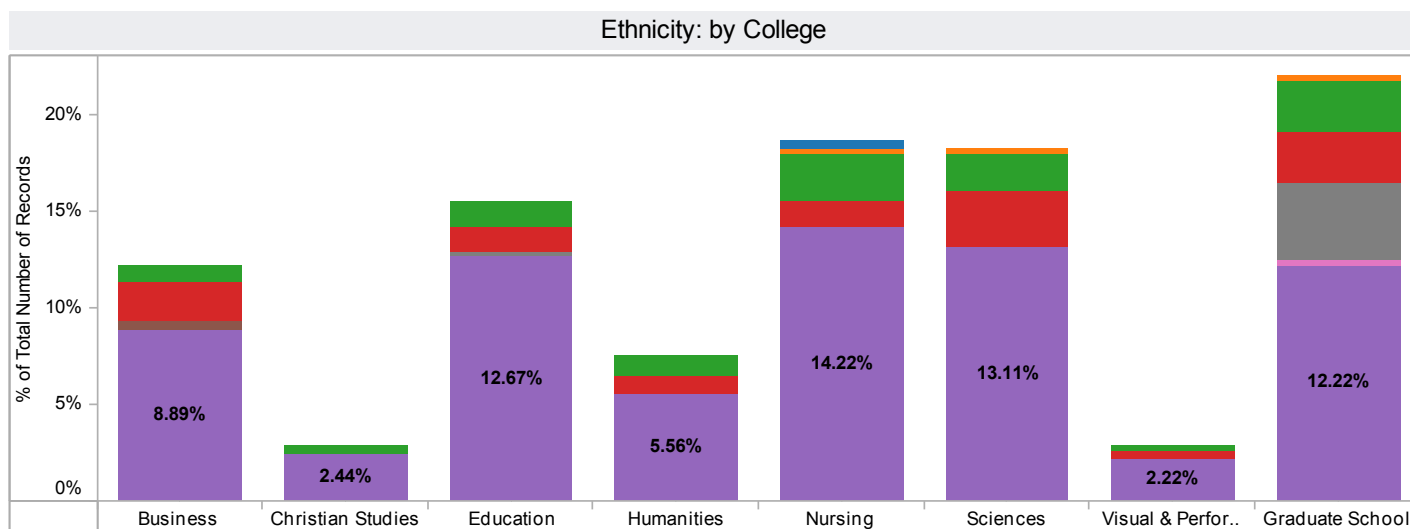

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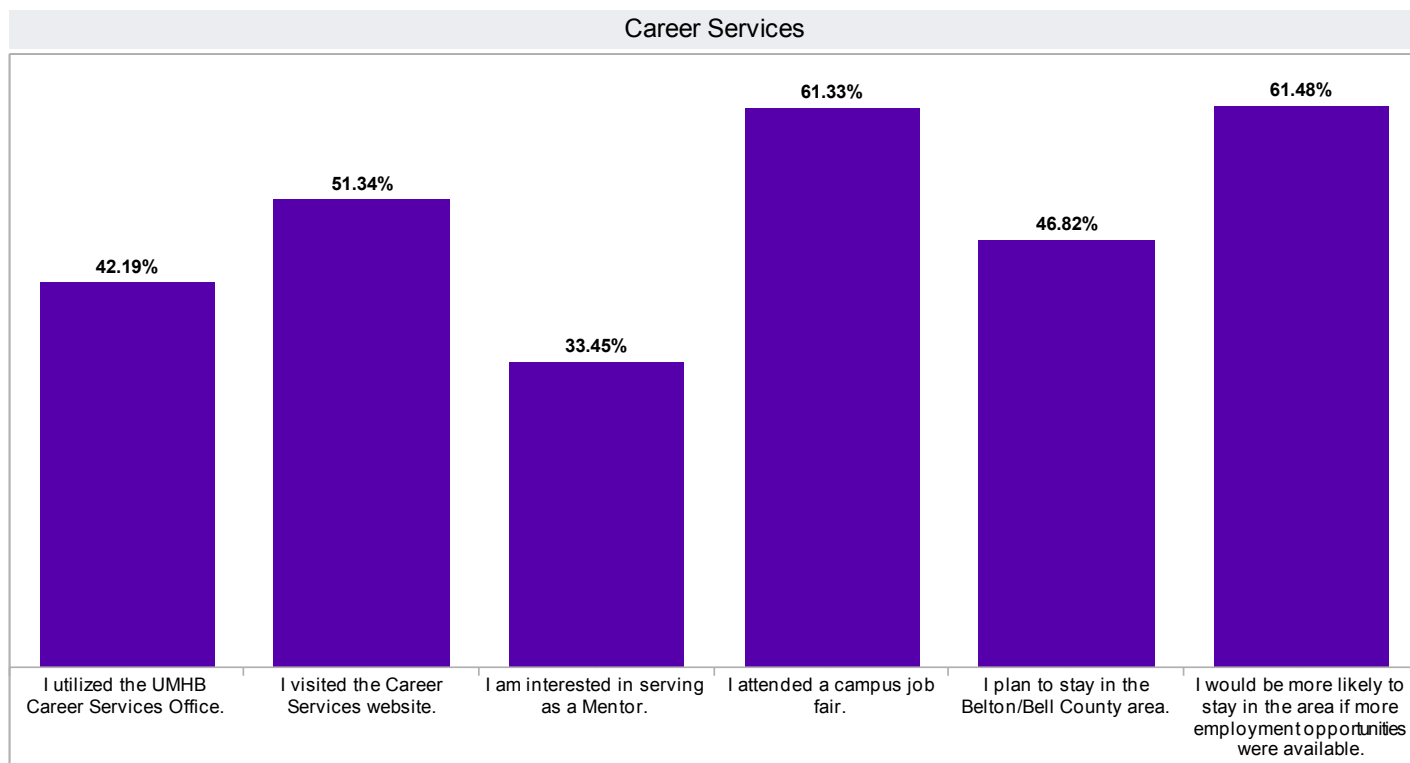

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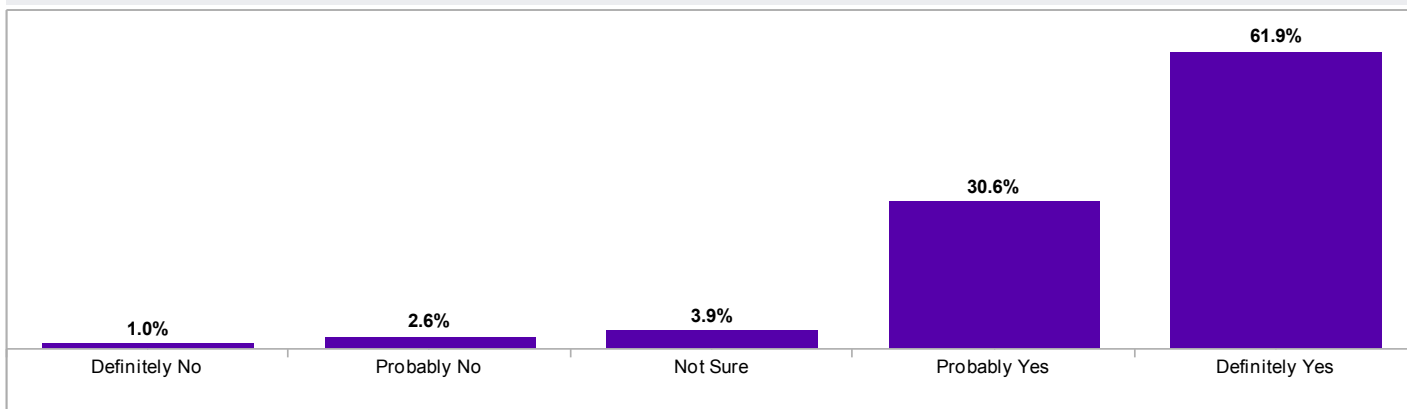

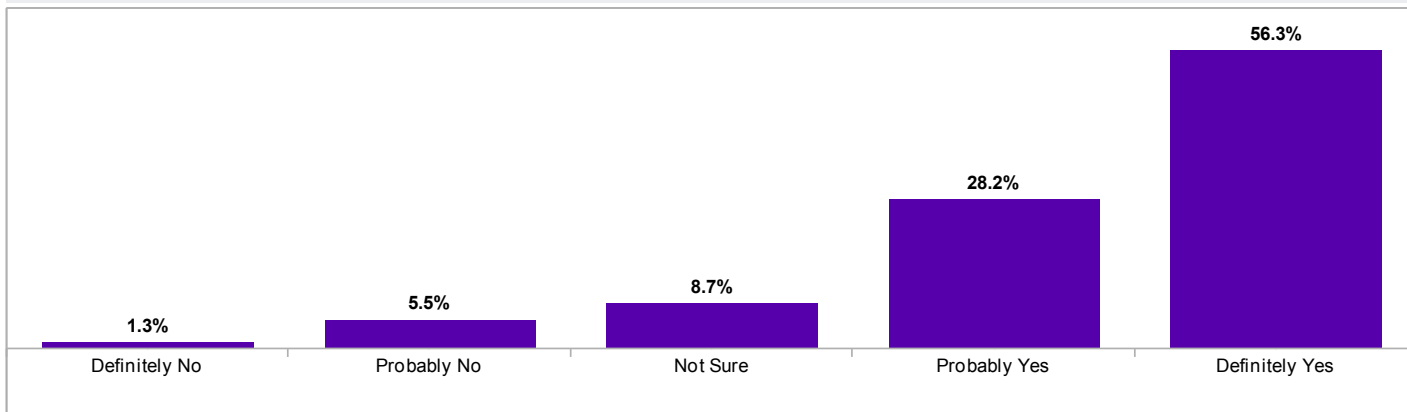

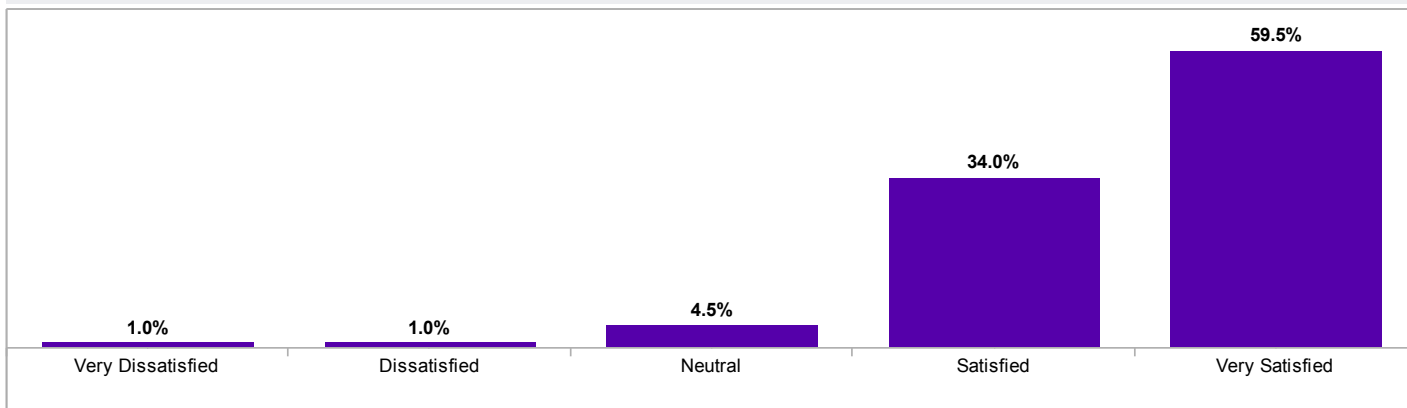

Overall UMHB experience.



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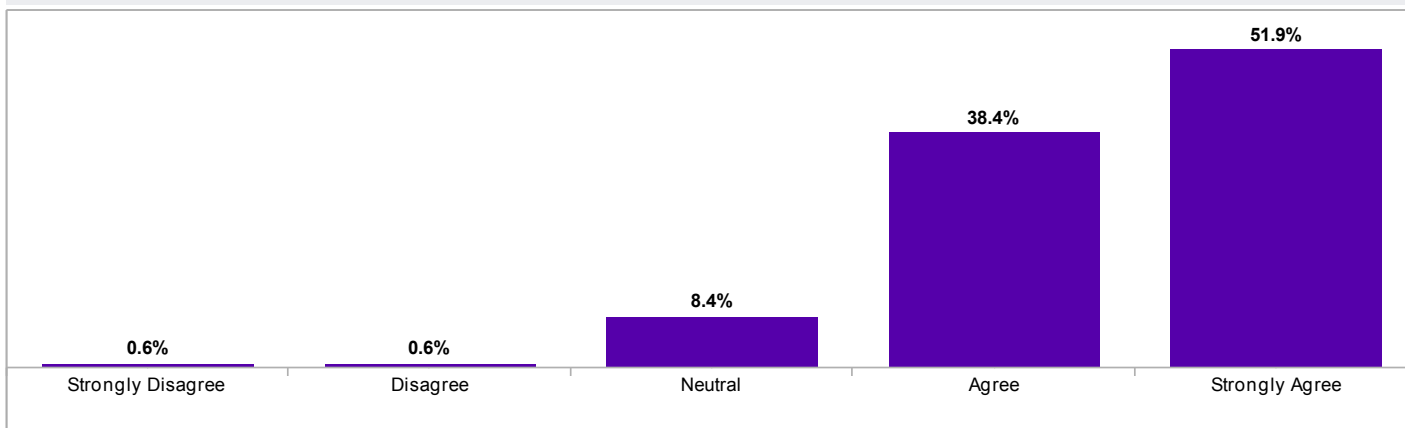

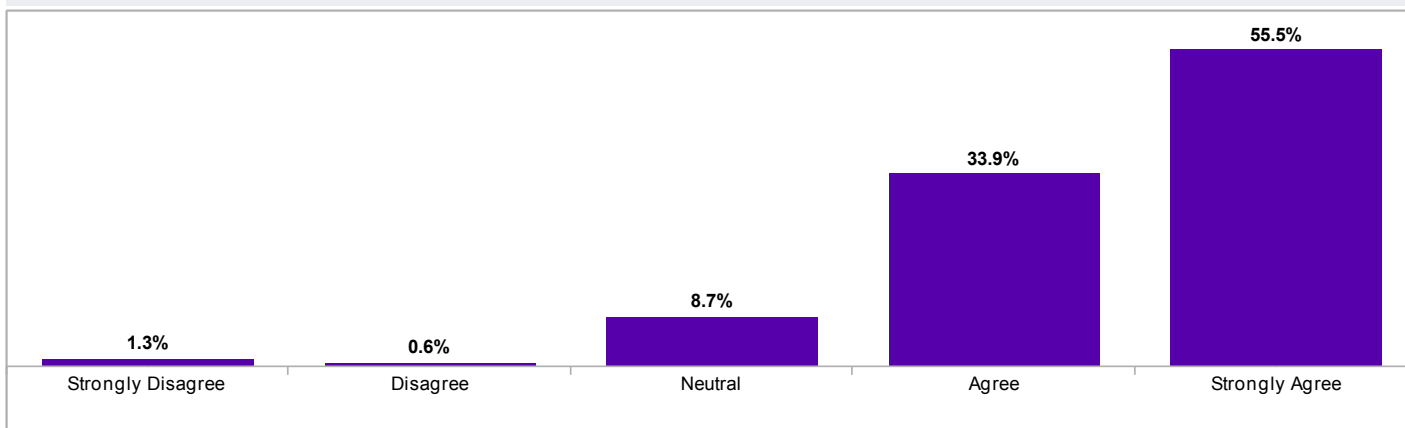
