Despite the challenges, it is essential for Christian campuses to continue to work toward building a healthy, multiracial environment for their students and employees. In this pre-conference, you will have the opportunity to process and collaborate with other passionate leaders facing similar challenges. The content is designed for all student life professionals who would like to be encouraged and strengthened in their work, regardless if you have an "official" diversity role on campus or not. The first two sessions will be focused on YOU. Do you feel motivated? Encouraged or discouraged? Equipped? Then, we will discuss practical steps you can take to be an effective advocate for the long haul. The last two sessions will focus on your CAMPUS. Do you feel like your campus is moving forward, stuck in limbo, or moving backward?
